



PHRASE AFFIRMATIVE

I	BASE FORM	<i>I work</i>
YOU	BASE FORM	<i>You work</i>
HE	BASE FORM + S	<i>He works</i>
SHE	BASE FORM + S	<i>She works</i>
IT	BASE FORM + S	<i>It works</i>
WE	BASE FORM	<i>We work</i>
YOU	BASE FORM	<i>You work</i>
THEY	BASE FORM	<i>They work</i>



A la troisième personne du singulier, si le verbe se termine en:

- s, sh, ch, x, z, o → +ES *He watches, she wishes, it does*
- Consonne-Y → I + ES *He cries, it flies*

PHRASE NEGATIVE

DO NOT (DON'T) + BASE FORM

I don't work, you don't work...

3^{ème} du singulier: **DOES NOT (DOESN'T)** + BASE FORM

She doesn't work, he doesn't work, it doesn't work

PHRASE INTERROGATIVE

DO + S + BASE FORM

Do I work? Do you work?

3^{ème} du singulier: **DOES** + S + BASE FORM

Does she work? Does he work? Does it work?
